



1. **Open Internet Browser** (Internet Explorer, Chrome, Firefox, Safari, etc.)
2. Within the URL/Address Bar type in www.region18.org
3. Once on the Region18 homepage hover over the **STUDENTS** tab and when the drop down menu appears click on **Library Resources**.
4. At the top of the page under **School Libraries**: click on **Lyme-Old Lyme High School Library Media Center**



→ Q: Looking for Books?

A: Use Destiny (LOLHS LMC Card Catalog)

1. Go to the LOLHS Library Home page at lolhslibrary.weebly.com or follow the directions above.
2. Hover over **Library Resources** tab which is located at the top of the webpage.
3. Click on **Online Card Catalog (Destiny)**. If you cannot see the Follett Destiny icon scroll down a bit. Click on the **Follett Destiny icon**.
4. Click on **Lyme-Old Lyme High School**.
5. In upper right hand corner, click Login.



6. Enter your network username and password. This is the same username/password you use to login in to use the computers at the school.
7. Now that you are logged-in you can search our holdings and save your resources in your personal resource list. Conduct a **Basic Search** using keywords.
8. After searching the catalog you will see an icon to the right of each entry; **Add to this List**. If you would like to save this entry click **Add to this List**. If you want to obtain more information on each holding click, **Details**. If you do not see results you like try clicking on **Refine Your Search?** **Browse Subjects?** These hyperlinks are above your search results.
9. *Improve Your Search*: Conduct a **Power Search** that includes our online databases by click on the **Power** tab which is located across the top-right of the screen.
10. **!!!!Search one day and find your search history the next!!!!.....**on the basic search page click on **My Searches** (in upper right hand corner) to see past searches.
11. **HELPFUL HINT**: You can create a bibliography for the resources you find in Destiny. Email me or stop by for help with this.


Q: How do I find reliable and trustworthy sources?

A: Try searching an online database.



iCONN (Connecticut's reSEARCH Engine)

1. Go to the LOLHS Library Home page at lolhslibrary.weebly.com or follow the directions above.
2. Hover over the Library Resources tab and then click on **Online Databases Access**.
3. Click on the button that reads **Click Here to Access iCONN**. –OR– scroll down a bit to complete a **ONEsearch** of articles.
4. **HELPFUL HINT: Create an Account with My Ebscohost** and **Sign In** each time you use iCONN so that you can create and save search results and resource lists.



A: Try Power Searching....




1. Go to the LOLHS Library Home page at lolhslibrary.weebly.com or follow the directions above.
2. Hover over the **Research Tools** tab. Click on **Power Search Tips for the Open Internet**. Here you will find helpful tips and tricks to help you navigate the open internet.

➡ Q: How do I cite my source easily?

A: Use NoodleTools

1. Go to the LOLHS Library Home page at lolhslibrary.weebly.com or follow the directions above.
2. Hover over **Research Tools**. Hover over **Help with Citations** and click on **NoodleTools**
3. Click on **Create a Personal ID**.
4. Username: lolhs. Password: wildcats.
5. **Click on Create New Project**. Follow the step-by-step instructions and use the tutorials to guide your use of this citation generator. Create a description of your project and select the appropriate style for your citations.
6. Share your project with your teacher. In the **Sharing and Collaboration** box click that you would like to share your project with your teacher's drop box. OR share you project with friends if you are collaborating (working together).
